Eurail's product range 2009

2009 is a significant year for Eurail, marking the 50th anniversary of Eurail Passes. Since Eurail's introduction in 1959, the range has been improved and expanded dramatically, resulting in today's wide range of flexible passes. Product development remains a priority for Eurail. Consequently further countries and passes have recently been added to the product range, giving customers even more choice and freedom to explore Europe. Below is a summary of the changes to the Eurail Pass product range, since the publication of the 2007 Media Kit.

Eurail One Country Passes

Eurail National Passes have now been renamed to *Eurail One Country Passes*. This range has been extended to include five new passes. From 2009, the Eurail Holland Pass has been discontinued. Senior discounts are no longer available for the Norway and Sweden Passes, however Saver Pass discounts are now offered in 2nd class. The full range of One Country Passes is now as follows:
